

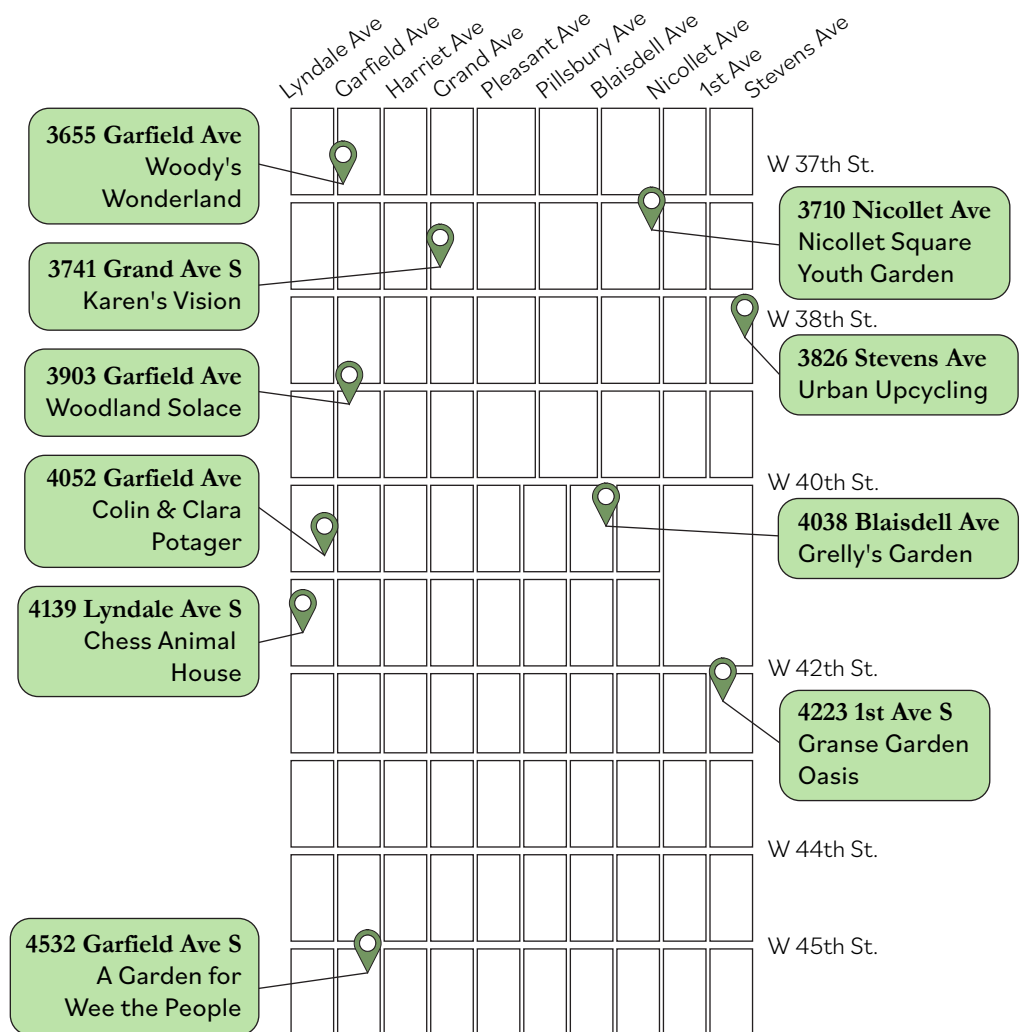
2026 Kingfield Garden Tour - Sustainable and Seussical

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3655 Garfield Ave - Woody's Wonderland

Brian's garden contains hundreds of bulbs, dozens of Hostas, mostly indigenous plants, bushes, trees, a water feature, raised vegetable gardens and more.

3710 Nicollet Ave - Nicollet Square Youth Garden

Around the back of the building, the youth in residence maintain a garden that features a circular plot for flowers, a fire pit and raised beds for vegetables.

3741 Grand Avenue S - Karen's Vision

Karen and Steve's garden is a mix of the old and the new, beginning with the dream of a gathering space for friends and family. Previous owners installed the fence and vines in the late 1970s, and the Kasota stone and river rocks they used for a patio and planters were saved and re-purposed. Karen and Steve added the pergola and garden boxes in 2019 and 2020, and their grandchildren helped with the Fairy and Gnome Gardens. The gardens they encompass are a mix of perennials, annuals and herbs. Welcome to their place of peace.

3826 Stevens Ave- Urban Upcycling

For twenty years Tammy has been transforming her yard from patchy grass to Magical, Pollinator-Friendly, UpCycled Art Gardens. It features Flowers, Rain Gardens, with Found & UpCycled Art, Trinkets, Medicinal Plants (rethinking what we call 'weeds') & a couple Chickens running around. Most everything is ReCycled... Furniture, Garden Items, Stones, Art & most Perennial plants were found at Yard sales, Thrift stores, or were items put out in the trash or from our neighborhood 'Buy Nothing Group' (a fantastic resource). She buys most her Vegetable & Annual Flowers at the Kingfield Farmer's Market. She is looking forward to Sharing her Gardens with You!

3903 Garfield Ave - Woodland Solace

Tucked into the heart of the city, Jolene and her daughter Mila's, shaded woodland garden offers a quiet retreat layered with texture and seasonal color. In the backyard, established pine trees create a calming canopy over lush perennials, native plantings, and raised vegetable beds - the perfect place to have a glass of wine and unwind.

4038 Blaisdell Ave - Grelly's Garden

Shelly and Grant's back garden is mostly raised garden beds with a mix of flowers and vegetables -okra, tomatoes, peppers, garlic, kale, beans, cucumbers, raspberries and a couple of young fruit trees... mixed with sunflowers, an array of cutting flowers and other pollinator attracting native forbes and grasses.

4052 Garfield Ave - Colin & Clara Potager

For the past twelve years, Colin and Clara have been working on thier big corner lot. They have designed and built a backyard kitchen garden/ Potager that features a fruit tree orchard, vegetables, herbs, and even chickens! Permaculture practices include densely packed variety of garden delights and native species.

4139 Lyndale Ave S - Chess Animal House

Liz, Steve and Artemis's garden is a landmark on Lyndale. Larger than life animals play on a yard size chessboard. The front yard is full of perennials and natives, and additional gardens flow into the backyard and alley. They are a mix of plants that are pretty and plants you can eat. Come enjoy their four years of hard work!

4223 1st Ave S - Granse Garden Oasis

Highlights of Amanda, Bella and Erik's shade garden are a rock and water features, a gazebo, and foundation plantings and a few raised vegtable beds.

4532 Garfield Ave S - A Garden for Wee the People
